To set standards for professional practice, as set out in the CNHC Code of Conduct, Ethics and Performance and the BANT Handbook.

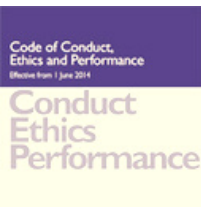
To support the implementation of these standards by practitioners and advise members on how to apply the guidelines.
